BUILDING COMMUNITY

The power of community has never been more clear or obvious than this year. As a faith community, we found new ways to build connections with one another. Our worship services and faith studies have allowed us to reach new people we never could have involved before we went virtual—spreading to Arizona, Wisconsin, South Dakota, Florida, and Washington, to name a few. Small groups, Bible studies, and our youth met for walks, on ZOOM, at farms, backyards, patios, parking lots, and garages.

Each week, we have between 30 and 50 people gathering in virtual or social-distancing groups. Our youth have met in the parking lot to play Scattergories and our Saturday men's group doubled the frequency they meet with one another. Members have extended their invitation to neighbors to join us for our small groups, community service, and social justice work. We held three worship services outside, bringing together the newborns and the seasoned members. A family bike and pizza night brought the generations together on a beautiful night.

Our whole directory was covered in phone calls and cards. Online, you frequently shared your prayer requests and prayed for each other. The tools and formats that we use look a lot different than a year ago, but the spirit is strong. Our lives are better for the connections and relationships we have formed and strengthened.

The Outreach Committee continues to adapt to 2020! We started off the year with our monthly free Community lunches, until we had to cancel due to Covid. We continue to support Simpson Shelter financially each month. Our partnership with ICA is still going strong, our food shelf is open twice per month and continues to grow. As the need became greater with all of the Covid hardships, we turned our Little Free Library into a Little Free Pantry last March and have kept it constantly stocked thanks to all of your generous donations!

During our food shelf day in September, we gave away back packs and school supplies. We had a great turn out when we filled gift bags for the teachers at Excelsior Elementary as a thank you for all they do! Our annual trunk or treat event was extra cold, but fun and safe:) For the first time this year, we will be a turkey dinner pick up sight for ICA. We're hoping to once again finish off the year giving Christmas gifts to His House families. This church family is amazingly kind and generous and continues to step up to help our neighbors in need!



STANDING FOR JUSTICE

The Social Justice Ministry Team focused on racial justice and climate issues in 2020.

With a goal of reducing our carbon footprint, the team worked to ensure that a large percentage of church waste products are recycled or composted. EUMC is a certified Climate Justice congregation and a charter member of the West Interfaith Climate Hub.

We also led our solar panel project, with solar panels set to be installed by mid-December on the church roof.

In light of recent protests for racial justice this year, the team charged a sub-group to delve into racial injustice and white privilege. The group invited the congregation to:

Learn about white privilege and systemic racism, Reflect on our role in the racist systems in our Country, State and Nation, and Act by creating a plan for racial justice action. The group also:

- Wrote a Declaration for Racial Justice committing EUMC to work toward healing racial inequity
- Compiled resources to share with the congregation
- Helped survey the congregation regarding race
- Encouraged EUMC members to participate in discussions about race
- Provided resources for our Black Lives Matter Sunday in October, and hosted an online discussions after all of the October worship service
- Promoted EUMC's purchase our United Methodists Stand Against Racism banner






