PASTORAL UPDATE





VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT

Jeffrey Fawbush is a familiar face up front in worship. He has been involved in the music ministry ever since he first started attending 27 years ago. He shared that what he appreciates about our faith community are the outreach efforts and the welcoming members. You can often find him downstairs in our kitchen practicing, usually about four hours a day. As he says," practicing my saxophone hasn't always been welcomed by family or roommates so I have been using the downstairs church kitchen for many years. The tall ceiling and hard surfaced walls make the room great acoustically and provide a natural reverberation that makes it very conducive to practicing."

Volunteer roles: Meals on Wheels, Simpson shelter, RUMM, community lunch, music ministry, other projects

Instruments he plays: saxophone, flute, guitar, keyboard

Favorite styles of music: jazz, rhythm and blues, funk and soul

Favorite band: Earth Wind & Fire or Tower Of Power

Favorite musicians: jazz saxophone players from the 50's and 60's: Dexter Gordon, Sonny Rollins, John Coltrane

Where he finds inspiration for the songs he writes: "On a daily basis I receive two devotionals and two bible verses online. Occasionally I will read a phrase that could be the basis for a song, and sometimes a melody will come to me that fits the words and I'll develop it from that point. Other times a melody or chord progression will come first then words will follow."

Jeff believes music is a powerful way that we can glorify God and express the message of love for all. To him, it is both a privilege and a responsibility to share his musical gifts with the community. We are so grateful for the ways Jeffrey has shaped our worship and music ministries here at Excelsior UMC. Thank you Jeff!



SOCIAL JUSTICE

Members of the Anti-Racism Team recently visited the Minnesota African American Heritage Museum and Gallery. Cofounder/Museum Manger, Coventry Cowens, explained each exhibit and Drew Hammond, a contributing social justice artist, walked us through each piece of art, nine of which were his works.
