PASTORAL UPDATE

We did it! It is so fantastic to share that we not only reached our stretch goal of \$1.5 million for Transforming for Tomorrow campaign, we *exceeded* it! To date, we have raised \$1.6 million in gifts and pledges. How wonderful it was to come together in hopes for the future of our faith community and inspire one another through loving and sacrificial generosity.

I called to share this news with one of our members who can't join us in person for worship, and she immediately started crying out of joy. She said, "after such a hard year, it feels so good to be part of something positive and meaningful. That's what this campaign is—something that gives us meaning and purpose." Her words have stuck with me ever since. It is so important for each of us to find joy and purpose, not only in our individual lives, but our communal lives as well. Coming together to work towards this goal, having important conversations about what matters and who we want to be, and each contributing what we can—has brought joy and purpose to this community in a renewed sense. Thank you for all you've done to shape that positivity and meaning for so many.

My biggest prayer and hope for this campaign has been that it would be something that unified our church—and that's exactly what it did! From young to old, from new members to veteran members, so many of you backed this with your whole heart and being. Some of our youngest members have been the most visibly excited about it—saving their allowance and tooth fairy money in glass jars or hosting bake sales at the church. Families brand new to our church in the past year or two enthusiastically jumped in to support the campaign. Our veteran members shared that they benefitted from those who prepared a welcoming place for them, and they want to make sure the space is welcoming for others. From a variety of perspectives and life experiences, the participation of this campaign was wide and deep. You make a pastor very, very proud.

2022 will be an important year in the life of this church, with much change ahead of us. I know it won't all go as smoothly as we might plan for (what building project ever does?) but knowing the spirits of the people who make up this faith community, I know we will be able to get through it with the same level of positivity and joy and meaning that we've started it with. There is a lot of work ahead, but first let us take a moment to celebrate the good work that has been done. Thank you!





Capital Campaign Results

We are nearing the end of the Capital Campaign Fund Raising phase of **Transforming for Tomorrow**.

Our stretch goal was \$1,500,000.

As of today, we have commitments for more than **\$1,600,000**, and we still have a few more commitments coming in. This is a monumental achievement!

When we began this journey, Pastor Brooke said, "We are not just trying to raise money! **This campaign is about our spiritual growth as individuals, families and a congregation."** The dollar total says that we succeeded in raising money. More important, the reason that we were successful is that almost everyone participated in the information and decision process, filling out surveys, attending gatherings, asking questions, raising concerns, voicing opinions, and returning Commitment Cards.

We had a dedicated team of 21 people on the Capital Campaign, each taking on their role and completing tasks, communicating updates and information, and staying on schedule so that the entire campaign ran smoothly.

And once again, the real reason this campaign was successful is because of the support, prayers and participation of the entire congregation.

LEADERSHIP

The Leadership Team has been busy the past couple months and we are currently focusing on the year ahead. Here are the highlights.

- Helped to support the staff in what turned out to be a wonderful Advent/Christmas season for the church. It was great to be "in-person" again for a meaningful Christmas pageant and 3 Christmas Eve Services. If you missed one of these remember that you can always watch later through the EUMC website.
- The Transforming for Tomorrow Capital Campaign wrapped up in December and announced to the Leadership Team that our goal was not only met but exceeded. We were thrilled to know that the members and friends of EUMC helped raise over \$1.6 M.
- So that we can stay on the timeline that was projected in the Capital Campaign the Leadership Team appointed two members to start working with Steve Colby, Property Manager, as quickly as possible to set in process the interviewing of construction firms. They will continue to work with the architectural company Station 19 who did the concept drawings.
- In January we will be begin the formal process of selecting a building committee. Some positions on this committee will be for the duration of the project and some may be specific to certain areas. If you are interested in this team, contact Pastor Brooke.
- We are refinancing our current mortgage loan and discussing what bridge financing will potentially be needed during the 3-year timeline of the Transforming for Tomorrow campaign.

As we approach February 2022 EUMC's Leadership will have operated for two years with this current structure. To rotate positions, we are continuing with the original plan to have 3-4 members rotate off each year. That means that some leaders served for only one year, some for two and now the last group with serve three years. This will allow for a normal rotation going forward of a 3-year term on the Leadership Team. The Nominations Committee will be looking at the open spots on the Leadership Team and all the Ministry Teams in the coming month and will present a slate of new leaders that will begin in March 2022. If you have an interest in serving on any of the committees at church, please let Pastor Brooke know.

We are still looking for help in filling the AV Sunday morning position so if you know anyone, please have them contact the church office.




We need you!


